

Doug Gregory has been the Florida Sea Grant Marine Agent and County Extension Director for Monroe County, Florida (aka The Florida Keys) since 1991. He previously was the Fishery Population Statistician for the Gulf of Mexico Fisheries Management Council for seven years where he coordinated management actions for the lobster and reef fish fishery management plans.

After earning a BA degree in Zoology from the University of South Florida in 1974 he started his career in fisheries science as a field technician for a University of Florida Sea Grant spiny lobster project in the Florida Keys. He used the lobster data for his Master's Thesis in Wildlife Ecology from the University of Florida in 1980. He spent four years at the University of Washington, College of Fisheries and Department of Statistics studying population dynamics and statistics but left UW to join the Gulf Fishery Council in 1984 with a BS degree in Statistics.

After leaving the employ of the Gulf Council he served on numerous Gulf Fishery Council stock assessment committees during the 1990's, including the Coastal Migratory Pelagics and Reef Fish Stock Assessment Panels and the SPR Management Strategy Committee. Since 2003 he has served in eleven SEDAR stock assessments and most recently served as chair for the SEDAR 22 Review Workshop. He has been a member of the Gulf Fishery Council's Scientific and Statistical Committee since 1991 and was a member of the South Atlantic Fishery Council's Scientific and Statistical Committee from 1997 through 2009.

He has received a number of professional awards ranging from his first in 1978 for the American Fisheries Society Best Student Paper Award to the 2008 NOAA Sustainable Fisheries Award in Public Communication and Education.
