

John Hunt is a Program Administrator with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission where he manages the South Florida Research Laboratory based in Marathon. He has worked in the Florida Keys for the Commission and in predecessors his entire career. Mr. Hunt received his B.S. degree (Biology) from Penn State in State College, PA in 1974 and his M.S. degree (Marine Science) from the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill in 1981.

For the past 30 years, he has conducted research on the spiny lobster and spiny lobster fishery in Florida. He has published numerous scientific articles on spiny lobsters and other topics related to fisheries management. The results of his research have been used to establish the current management system for Florida's spiny lobster fishery and in the establishment of the marine reserves of the Florida Keys National Marine Sanctuary and the Research Natural Area of Dry Tortugas National Park. He served as the State co-chair for the interagency Florida Bay Program Management Committee for 10 years and has convened numerous science conferences on Florida Bay and the Florida Keys.
