

Karen Meador is currently the Aransas Bay Ecosystem Leader for Coastal Fisheries Division of Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. She received her Bachelor of Science degree (Fisheries Science) from Texas A&M University in College Station, Texas in 1976.

For over 30 years, she has coordinated and implemented the resource and harvest monitoring programs of Texas in the Aransas Bay Ecosystem, the Corpus Christi Bay Ecosystem, and in the Gulf of Mexico. Specifics include reporting the biological, sociological and economic data pertaining to fishery and ecosystem management. She has published numerous papers and reports documenting the status of several marine species as well as various aspects of the monitoring programs.
